ENTER BARBARA WESTBROOK'S DESIGNER MODEL AT Sovereign. Buckhead's newest high-end, high-rise residence, and you immediately notice two things: texture and light. Whether it's the veneered early 20th-century tables, the abundance of wool, linen, silk, velvet and cashmere, or the quilting, fufting, beading and embroidery, every surface possesses a tactile quality that engages the senses and draws you immediately the walls but also on pairs of tall alabaster lamps and sallored. inward.
