#### TRY THIS AT HOME

- Try a lilac color scheme for a more sophisticated take on purple.
- Extend wall hangings to the ceiling to create a space-saving version of a canopy.
- Twin-bed rooms lend themselves to balanced arrangements. Create order and symmetry by coordinating the wallcovering, wall hangings, and throw pillows.
- Create subtext with soft variations. Here, the intermingled stripes, solids, and prints define individual features but do not overpower the overall design scheme.
- Bring exotic undertones into a room with simple bones by using accent pieces, such as the elephant lamp, antique bamboo nightstand, and geometric, embroidered accent pillows on the bed.

**A single nightstand** between two beds **serves both.** Place two lamps there or hang sconces by each bed to give guests individual light.

▲ A small space can still feel rich with thoughtful arrangements of properly scaled furniture and accessories. Here, textures and patterns lead the viewer's eye on a path of discovery.

#### TRY THIS AT HOME

- In a monochromatic room, add

bolsters on each bed for a dash of color that can easily be changed out for a slightly different effect.

- Adorn the headboards, pillow shams, and duvets with a low-contrast checked fabric for a pretty, layered look.

- Enliven the wall with an interesting

arrangement of artwork. Unify the look by framing them in similar black and gold frames.

- A pair of reading lamps on a shared night table is an ideal arrangement for twin beds. Place a basket underneath for an extra blanket or two.
